A note from Pastor Katie

Rest.

Recently, I have had several conversations with people - inside and outside of the church - who are in desperate need of rest to alleviate their exhaustion. Rest from overworking and overdoing. Rest from caregiving and serving. Rest from illness and injury.

There are also folks yearning for rest in terms of a deep pause. A pause to open time for renewing and repairing relationships. A pause to give space for both joyous and traumatic events to settle in and new routines to emerge. A pause to be in the presence of God and those we love.

We know the importance of rest. We know our bodies, minds, and spirits function better when rest is a regular part of our lives. We know our ability to be in relationship with people is enhanced when we rest. We know our ability to vision, dream, and discern God's call for our lives and our communities emerges with rest.

With so many, if not all, of us in need of rest, it's surprising that it is counter-cultural to create space to make it happen.

I have wondered for awhile what it looks like for communities of faith to provide that space, model that space, empower folks to seek and create that space in their individual and our communal lives together.

We as individuals and as a community of faith need rest to be renewed...to dream...and to discern. We need rest that brings us together to "be" in the presence of God and one another.

I wonder how we can create that space together at Oakhurst. What are your thoughts?

CHARM, The Center for Hard to Recycle Materials, will soon open a second location at 1225 Columbia Drive in Dekalb County! CHARM recycles items like electronics, mattresses,

cooking oil, tires, textiles, appliances, metals, plastics and more. While curbside plastic recycling is limited to jugs and bottles with necks, CHARM accepts plastics 1, 2, 4, 5, and 6, and stretchy plastic film. Creationwise is going to place a Charm Plastics recycling bin in the Fellowship Hall near the glass and battery recycling. We invite you to place clean, dry plastics from home in the bin and Creationwise will take them to CHARM for you.
